Project Highlights

- Beneficiaries: 70% aged 65 or above
- Chronically-ill patients, e.g. cancer patients; with prescription from HA
- Priority to the underprivileged

Quick Figures (Oct 09-Dec 14)

- Community Pharmacy x 2
- Free drugs: 861 patients (\$36.6M)
- Subsidized drugs:6,203 patients (\$26.4M)
- Annual saving per patient \$8,910
