

Community Living Room – Sharing Resources and Care

Transcript of Cantonese short video

Voiceover:

The “Pilot Scheme on Community Living Room” initiated by the Government is one of the targeted poverty alleviation projects providing “subdivided unit”(SDU) households with additional living space while organising various caring activities to enhance their wellbeing and encouraging mutual support and resource sharing to strengthen community bonds together.

Both the Hung Hom and Sham Shui Po Community Living Rooms(CLR) host “Frozen Meals Sharing Day” where volunteers prepare nutritious meals in the food factory using advanced flash-freezing technology to preserve both flavor and nutritional value. These carefully packaged meal boxes are delivered to the CLRs where members collect their meals and reheat them in the microwave oven in the shared kitchen to enjoy together with others experiencing community warmth.

Meanwhile, the To Kwa Wan CLR features a “Lending Corner” where members can borrow items helping reduce living expenses while promoting resource sharing and community inclusion. The corner includes a “Wish Board” for members to suggest new sharable items making CLR’s services more responsive.

The first floor of the To Kwa Wan CLR also houses a “Food Bank”, stocked with donated daily necessities. Members earn points through frequent visits and activity participation at CLRs to redeem rice, noodles, canned food and detergent at the “Food Bank”.
