“The Pilot Programme on Community Living Room” focuses on supporting “subdivided unit”(SDU) households by providing additional living space including dedicated areas for SDU children to study and play alleviating the stress arising from crowded living conditions. The children’s playing corner is spacious with different toys available where children can play together and expend energy. Young music enthusiasts enjoy free access to music room and band room to explore musical creativity. These spacious, comfortable Community Living Rooms(CLR) create joyful experiences.

CLRs regularly organise various activities and interest classes including art workshops, music lessons and sports classes helping children unleash their potential while enriching their extracurricular activities for well-rounded development. Under instructor guidance, children can learn and master new skills building their

confidence while fostering learning motivation. The activities also encourage peer interaction, teaching cooperation, sharing, and communication. Families can join parent-child workshops to create crafts together, participate in exercises, outings and visits, enjoying quality family time while expanding social connections and developing sense of belonging to the community.
