WHAT IS OUR MISSION?

Assisting those in need and promoting upward mobility of children and youth have all along been a key aspect of the work of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government. Since 2014, the Commission on Poverty (CoP), chaired by the Chief Secretary for Administration, has been implementing the "Future Stars – Upward Mobility Scholarship" to assist youths from underprivileged backgrounds, encourage them to maintain a positive attitude in adversities, and enhance their capacity of climbing the social ladder by way of scholarships of \$5,000.

Notwithstanding the hardships they face, "Upward Mobility Scholarship" awardees demonstrate persistence as well as aspiration and determination to excel themselves. The CoP hopes to provide continual support to these youths and will be implementing the "Future Stars Mentoring Programme", under which scholarship donors and individuals from all walks of the community will become mentors to our scholarship awardees. Mentors will be encouraged to share their life stories and make use of their network to widen the exposure of their mentees, inspire and help them with life planning, schooling and career choices, encourage them to think positively and enhance their feeling of hope for the future, thereby empower these youths to achieve upward social mobility.

WHAT IS THE PROGRAMME ABOUT?

The "Future Stars Mentoring Programme" is an individual mentoring programme, under which mentors will be matched with scholarship awardee (mentees) in accordance with mentor's preference. Mentors are encouraged to share and exchange views with their mentees on subjects like life planning, schooling and career choices and overcoming obstacles.

For a period of at least 6 months from July to December, mentors and mentees will meet for at least 4 times. After the 6-month period, mentors and mentees may decide mutually if they would like to continue their mentormentee relationship.

The CoP has engaged The Salvation Army to provide support to mentors and mentees under the programme.
